

SAFETY ASPECTS TO CONSIDER

It's always important to consider all safety aspects before hosting a block party. Respecting the neighborhood you live in and honoring the city ordinances/regulations is a great way to build the foundation for a successful party.

TIPS/INSTRUCTIONS FOR SPECIFIC RESOURCE

- Follow any guidelines that the city has laid out for local ordinances and regulations.
- The top 3 most common mistakes are parking on the street or impeding traffic, excessive noise from music being played, and fire not being controlled properly. All of these are ordinances you can easily find more information about on your city's government website or by calling the local sheriff's department.
- If parking on the street, make sure the car is facing in the correct direction and ensure you're not blocking a driveway, fire hydrant, or crosswalk.
- Make sure to be parked no closer than 15 feet from a stop sign or intersection.
- Permits are not required for campfires and bonfires, but they must be approved by the Fire Marshal's office or the Battalion Chief prior to use. Recreational fire pits are not to be used for burning of trash or large amounts of yard waste. The fire pit shall not be located within 25 feet of a structure or any combustibles. It must not be any larger than three feet in diameter, or more than two feet in height.
